GREEN BUSINESS PRACTICES mean reduced costs, increased competitiveness, potential for increased client or customer base, increased efficiency, and productivity. They also can lead to savings in energy costs. Recycling, energy conservation, energy-efficient office equipment, and water-saving devices all save money by cutting bills.

Here are some easy ways to start saving money:

Make sure all equipment is turned off at the end of the day rather than left on standby.

Buy recycled goods and products.

Set a goal of purchasing from local suppliers and vendors. It is understood that for certain goods, services, and products there are no local vendors.

Set up recycling system for bottles, cans, photocopier cartridges, batteries, printer ink cartridges, and plastic.

Set a goal of going paperless for internal communications and files where possible.

Remember, the 'green economy' presents opportunities for businesses in Cayuga County to find new markets for goods and services, create products and product lines, and increase profitability and sustainability.

Did You Know...

The latest New York State
minimum wage poster is
available?

Employer Risks and Exposures

Because the minimum wage in New York State will increase from \$7.15 to **\$7.25** per hour on **July 24, 2009**, the NYS Department of Labor has issued an updated poster with the new minimum wage rate listed.

Employers are required to display the minimum wage poster in a conspicuous location at each NYS work site to allow both employees and applicants the opportunity to review it. Failure to display the poster may result in a fine from the Department of Labor.

Avoiding Disaster

Post the new minimum wage poster at each NYS work site no later than July 24, 2009. Make sure to place the poster in a conspicuous location where it is accessible to applicants and employees with disabilities and limited mobility.

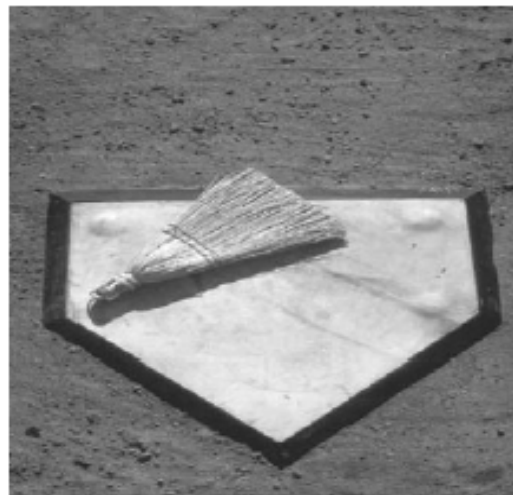

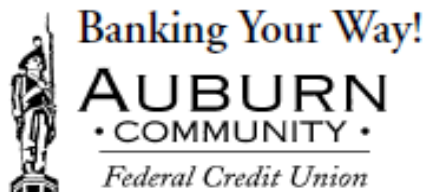

Power For Jobs Extended

Governor Paterson signed into law an extension of the Power for Jobs program. This discount power program, administered through the New York Power Authority, supplies low-cost power, or power subsidies, to companies in exchange for pledges to retain and create jobs. The program is extended through May 15, 2010.

"The savings provided through these programs are vital to hundreds of employers and thousands of workers across New York," said Ken Pokalsky, Senior Director of Government Affairs, The Business Council of New York State.

The Business Council noted that the cost of industrial power in New York State is already 40 percent higher than the national average and the cost of commercial power is 65 percent higher than the national average. This program helps reduce the cost of electric power for hundreds of energy intensive businesses across New York State.

"This extension is a 10-month solution to a long term problem," said Pokalsky. "High energy costs affect many energy intensive operations in New York. We urge Governor Paterson and the Legislature to work with business to adopt a long term economic development power program."

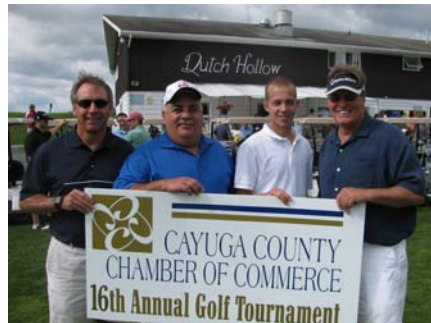
